DISTINGUISHED JURORS

DR. NANCY BARNO REYNOLDS has been an active participant in the arts for more than 30 years, as a student, working artist, judge, curator, teacher, collector, and patron. Since 2018, she has served the Broome County Arts Council as their Executive Director, responsible for an organizational rebrand, overhaul in mission and vision, and creation of increased public programming, services, and membership. Through grant writing, Barno Reynolds raised over a half million dollars for the arts in Broome County and, in 2018, launched BCAC's Artisan Gallery, an arts retail and exhibition space.

DR. DIANE BUTLER has been the director of the Binghamton University Art Museum for seven years. She has an eclectic background: an undergraduate degree in music, and a master's degree in Africana Studies and Art History, as well as a PhD in Art History from Cornell University. For her dissertation she studied maps of Africa printed between the 16th and 18th centuries. Prior to her arrival at Binghamton University, Diane worked at three academic museums – in the education and curatorial departments at the Johnson Museum of Art at Cornell University, as a curator at Colgate University, and as the Andrew W. Mellon Coordinator of Academic Affairs at the Frances Lehman Loeb Art Center at Vassar College.

BETSY KELLY GREEN is a well known figure in the NEPA art community hailing from both Susquehanna & Wyoming counties. After graduating from Penn State University, she traveled extensively, living in Los Angeles, Mexico and several other locations, finally settling in New York City for 20 years before returning to Tunkhannock, PA to raise her daughter. Betsy is known for her work at Lizza Studios, a world-renowned art reproduction facility and gallery in Tunkhannock, PA. As manager and gallery director at Lizza's for over a decade, she curated over 40 local, national and international exhibits during her time there. For the past five years she has been a design consultant with Creative Interior Imagery, a state-of-the-art facility in West Pittston, PA. Betsy has also been on the board of The Kitson Arts Alliance as their art consultant and curator for the past three years, at the same time serving as one of the coordinators of the North Branch Art Trail.

ABOUT THE PARTNERS

Cloud Croft Studios

Nestled in the hills five miles south of Owego, Cloud Croft Studios consists of barn studio spaces and 90 acres of scenic property. The barn provides several spaces for artists to work and to give classes, and the property has miles of trails and several ponds. Together they provide an opportunity for an artist to create an art experience to remember.

Tioga Arts Council
